<b>Conscience</b>		The tool humans use to make decisions between right and wrong. Christians believe that this is given to us by God and it helps us to avoid evil.
<b>Evil</b>		The absence of goodness. This can cause other people to suffer so that we get what we want.
<b>Free Will</b>		Free will means we can make choices for ourselves without being controlled by someone or something else. For example humans have free will to choose between right and wrong.
<b>Goodness</b>		The quality of being like God. Goodness is when we look to make others happy without thinking of our own happiness or rewards.
<b>Incarnation</b>		Latin word meaning “made flesh”. Christians believe that God became human in the person of Jesus. He was fully human and fully divine.
<b>Natural Law</b>		The rules for right and wrong that help creation to function correctly. These rules never change and apply to every person, now and forever
<b>Privation</b>		To stop or prevent something. For example evil is the privation of good
<b>Suffering</b>		Pain or loss which harms human beings. Some suffering is cause by other human beings (moral evil); some is not (natural evil)
